Recognize Interest in Suspense for Past Due Accounts

Product: Finacle Core Banking Version: 10.x onwards

Based on the classification of a loan account, banks can decide whether to recognize the interest income or not. In scenarios where banks want to charge interest, but do not consider it as income as it is a **non-performingasset (NPA)**, then the **Interest Suspense Account** can be used to give the interest credit.

While marking an account as Past Due, the system will reverse any uncollected interest for the normal and penal interest in the accounts and credit it to the **Interest Suspense** or **Penal Interest Suspense** account.

Whenever the customer makes full or partial repayment, if the amount in suspense has to be recognized as income, the flag **Recognize Interest in Suspense for Past Due Account** in **HSCFM- Bank level**, should be set as **Yes**. If this flag is **Yes**, the system will automatically recognize the interest from suspense interest to normal interest on recovery of any interest income for **NPA** accounts.

If the bank wishes to recognize the interest income at a later point in time, the movement of the interest amount from the su spense account to the **P and L** account can be handled with the new menu option called **HRSI**, given that the **Recognize Suspense Interest** for **Past Due Accts** parameter is set as **No** at the **HSCFM** level. If the flag is **No**, then the bank needs to execute **HRSI** menu for recognizing the income to the extent of interest repayment recovered from the customer.

Enabling Root or Jailbreak Detection Security Feature in Finacle Mobile Banking

Product: Finacle Mobile Banking Version: 11.x onwards

A hacker can launch any application on a rooted or jailbroken device and access the local memory, call specific activities or can perform malicious activities in the application.

Ideally both Android and iOS operating systems by default would contain built-in user rights and restrictions. The process of removing such restrictions is called rooting and jailbreaking respectively.

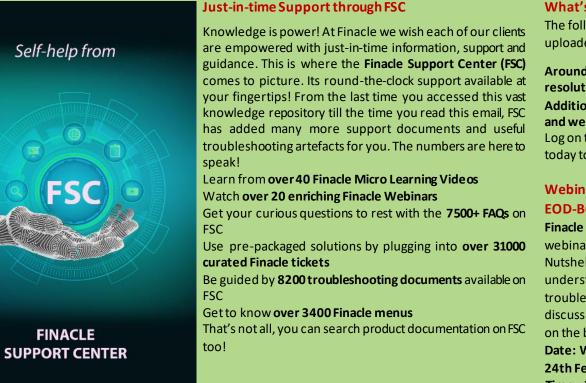
Allowing the Mobile Banking app to run in a rooted or jailbroken device is a major security risk. In such

devices, a hacker can easily access the local memory or mobile app-related API calls related data and can perform malicious activities. Considering the vulnerability of rooted or jailbroken devices, Finacle Mobile Banking is developed with a built-in ability to detect such conditions

and prevent the execution of the application. To enable root or jailbroke check detection in the application, open **AppController.js** in the client side (Android or iOS) application workspace and set **checktheme** value to **true**.

If the value for **checktheme** is set to **true**, then **Finacle Mobile Banking** application will not open in root or jailbroke devices.
